Outlook

Trade and investment opportunities exist in Grenada for Australian businesses, particularly in tourism, transport and related industries.

Bilateral relations

Australia's High Commissioner to Trinidad and Tobago is accredited to Grenada. Grenada does not have official representation in Australia.

Australia provided USD1m in support of the project preparation stage of Grenada's new Parliament House, which opened in June 2018, replacing a building destroyed in Hurricane Ivan in 2004.

Public diplomacy

Grenada is eligible for the [Endeavour Leadership Program](#). Under the previous Endeavour Mobility Grants and Endeavour Scholarships and Fellowships programs, two Grenadians were offered opportunities to undertake study, research and professional development in Australia.

Through the [Direct Aid Program](#), the Australian Government provides financial support to a range of projects in Grenada. In 2017-18, the Direct Aid Program supported projects focused on mangrove growth and fisheries development.

A Foreign Service officer from Grenada participated in the DFAT's International Graduate Program in 2017.

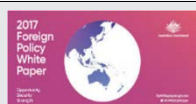
